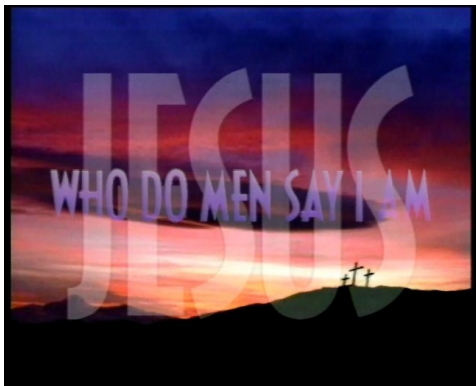

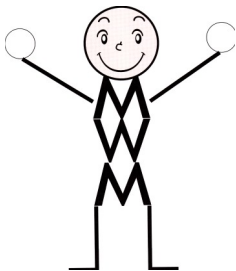




- Nicaragua is a small country in Central America. It is a tropical paradise, squeezed in between two big oceans. Nicaragua is bigger than Portugal or Ireland.

- The first mention of soap was on Sumerian clay tablets dating about 2,500 BC. The soap was made of water, alkali and cassia oil.
- One million dollars' worth of one-cent coins (100 million coins) weigh 246 tons.
- TIP is the acronym for "To Insure Promptness."
- The term "Blue Chip" comes from the color of the poker chip with the highest value, blue.
- Obadiah, with 21 verses consisting of 602 words, is the shortest book in the Old Testament, and the third shortest in the Bible.
- Almonds and pistachios are the only nuts mentioned in the Bible.
- The Pony Express only lasted 18 months, from April 1860 to October 1861.
- The FIRST TELEPHONE MESSAGE by Alexander Graham Bell on March 10, 1876, to his assistant Thomas Augustus Watson was "*Mr. Watson, come here I need you.*"

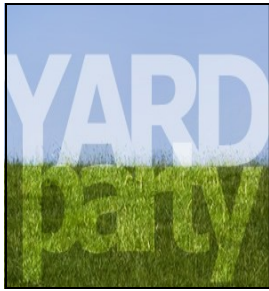

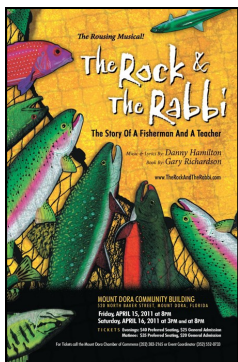
# Movie Night

# Mission Opportunity

**Winter Park Presbyterian Church has a mission trip opportunity in June or July, 2011. They are offering to include folk from New Life.**

John Gehrig, a member of Winter Park Presbyterian Church, has worked with VOSH (Volunteer Optometrists in the Service of Humanity) for many years. VOSH takes eye glasses and optometrists/ophthalmologists to third world countries, and holds clinics to examine eyes and fit glasses. John has been to most of the Central and South American countries and some African ones and recently came back from a week in Haiti. He says that what we see on television is pretty much the way things are in Haiti. He met a group in the hardest hit area that has a compound where they have medical clinics. So far they have not been able to offer eye exams or glasses.



John says many people in Haiti have never had an eye exam, and those who did wear glasses mostly lost them in the earthquake. He would like to take a team of 5 to 10 people to stay in a dorm style area of the compound. If he gets 5 people they will do the eye clinic. If there are 8 to 10, some will help with rebuilding homes in the area. The cost will be in the neighborhood of \$1,300.00 per person which will include the cost of some of the glasses.

Said he hadn't been able to read his bible in several years. This trip will be a real blessing to anyone who is able to go, and also a very real blessing to all those who will receive new glasses. 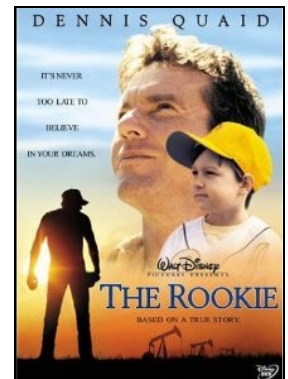
Feel the sun on your face as you savor the view from
